

Compound Word Connect

Remember that a compound word is simply 2 words joined together to make a new word e.g. sunflower (sun/flower)

Use the words below to create at least 8 different compound words.

flower	bow	chair	paper	coat
ache	foot	drop	ball	man
wheel	head	sun	barrow	flake
day	snow	wall	rain	band

Write each word into a sentence. Make sure that you spell the words that are on your Year 1 or Year 2 common exception word sheet correctly. Don't forget to use the correct punctuation for your sentence and take your time with your handwriting.

Plural and 3rd person Bingo

Create a bingo board like the one below for each person who is playing. You can just draw it on scrap paper

Make some cards and write one of these words on each card.

fish	church	dress	hop	tree	spoon
box	carry	wish	cow	dive	plate
catch	worry	wash	arrow	throw	aeroplane

Turn the cards face down. Take a card, read the word and decided first whether it is a noun or a verb. If it is a noun (person, place, object or animal), decide what the plural would be i.e. if there was more than one. If it is a verb (often, but not always, something you can do), imagine this in the third person i.e. he or she does that e.g. he writes, she laughs. Will you add 's' or 'es'? Cover the appropriate one on your board with your card. The first to cover all 8 squares on their board wins.

The general rule is if you can hear 'is' when you say the words, then it is 'es' e.g. Miss Oatey flashes her torch.

Year 2 children you should be recognising when there needs to be a change to the verb for 'es' is added e.g. hurry – hurries (y changes to i)
